Throughout this year our staff have attended after school meetings that allow us to plan for continual improvement across the curriculum, as well as up-skill teachers. Our staff have also undertaken additional professional learning in what are called 'Twilight Sessions' (3pm-6pm) in a range of areas to best meet the needs of our students.

Our school completed our second Twilight Session last week, with all staff now trained in CPR and Anaphylaxis. This is mandatory training for all Department of Education staff. We also completed some additional work on our Strategic Improvement Plan for 2021.

Road Safety

As we now have many parents and carers driving to drop off and collect students we are asking all drivers to ensure they follow all safety rules outside our school. Please DO NOT stop at the pedestrian crossing to drop off or pick up – this puts everyone's safety at risk.





Also, our speed limit is 40km/hour during school drop off and pick up times – this must be adhered to. We do not have a crossing guard so we require all community members to respect the safety of everyone.

Please be aware of some traffic infringements and the penalties for NSW School Zones. These road safety rules are in place to keep our students and community safe whilst travelling to and from school.

Your guide to driving and parking safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
 Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.

Hygiene procedures

We are committed to minimising risks to children and educators. Here are a few procedures we are adopting during this time:

- -Checking temperatures of children using a noncontact forehead thermometer as they enter the preschool.
- -If a child presents with symptoms we will contact you to collect them as soon as possible.
- -Children are encouraged to wash their hands regularly with soap and water.
- -We will continue explicitly teaching children what good handwashing looks like.
- -We are teaching children to cover their noses and mouths when they cough or sneeze by coughing into their elbow.
- If your child has been unwell please be sure to get a clearance certificate form your doctor before returning to preschool.
