

#### **Have Your Say on Diabetes in Schools**

Diabetes Australia is currently leading consultation to develop a national program to better support kids with type 1 diabetes in schools.

The new nationally consistent training program for teachers and school staff will be targeted at every school with a student with type 1 diabetes and this will cover the safe administration of insulin, hypoglycemia (low blood glucose level)



management, and 'normalising' diabetes in schools so the students are not stigmatised.

The program will also clarify the legal framework for diabetes management in schools and resolve any confusion over who can train school staff, and which school staff should be trained.

To ensure the new program meets the needs of schools, students and parents, and builds on all the good work already happening, we want to hear from you about what works and what needs to be improved.

#### Applying for a Selective High School in 2020

<u>Just a reminder - Applications for a Selective High School in 2020 close this week.</u>

Parents of students in Year 5 are able to apply for a Selective High School placement in 2020. If you have any questions about the process please contact the office. An information booklet is available for parents to read or alternatively you can access the link:

Applications must be made online between 9 October 2018 and 12 November 2018. Late applications will not be accepted. The school is unable to complete the application; it must be done by parents.

#### We are a 'Nut Aware' School

We currently have students enrolled at our school who are allergic to peanuts and nut products (peanut butter, nutella, hazelnuts etc). Please help us to keep all our students safe by ensuring your child does not bring food containing any nuts to school. Your support with this helps to minimise the risk of a student having a potentially life threatening reaction. Please speak with your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions.

#### Don't forget School Banking is on Wednesdays!

This is a great way to teach your child to save, as well as create an account that will support them later on in life.

Children who participate are rewarded with:

- A Youthsaver account;
- Dollarmites tokens that they can redeem for exciting rewards when they deposit regularly into their savings account;
- A Dollarmites deposit wallet to use when making School Banking deposits;
- A Platybank money box, along with a range of materials to help them learn and encourage them to save.



#### Did you know?

Every month that you make at least one deposit and don't take any money out of your Youthsaver account, you'll earn 'bonus interest'. Bonus interest is extra money the bank gives you as a reward for saving.

School banking occurs on Wednesday mornings.



^ In this document, the High Performing Students Unit will be referred to as the Unit.

'Parent' is defined under the *Education Act 1990* as a 'guardian or other person having custody or care of a child'.

#### What are selective high schools?

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, using specialised teaching methods and materials at the appropriate level.

Year 7 enrolments are available in:

- · eighteen fully selective high schools
- · twenty-four partially selective high schools
- fouragricultural high schools, three of which have boardingplaces where students live at the school for the school term. #### Important dates

You must apply online by 12 November 2018. The application site will close at 10pm on 12 November 2018. The closing date will be strictly observed except where there is a shortage of suitable candidates or where extenuating circumstances are serious and well documented.

You can change your school choices by 26 April 2019 by sending the *Change of choice* form to the Unit. You cannot change choices after 26 April 2019 unless something unexpected and outside your control changes and you have documentary evidence. A request for a *Change of choice* after 26 April must be approved by the Unit. Use the change of choice form at https://education.nsw.gov.au/RUblic-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7/information-for-applicants/choosing-a-selective-school

It is the parent's responsibility to liaise with the non-government school to ask the current school principal to complete the principal's page (for school marks) and ensure it is sent to the Unit by 7 December 2018.

If you have not received your *Test authority* advice by Friday 8 March 2019, you must emailthe Unit urgently. If you do not have emailyou can phone the Unit.

If some problem such as sickness or an accident stops your child from taking the test or from doing his or her best either in the test or at the school, you can make an illness/misadventure request using the form on the Unit's website. The form must reach the Unit by Thursday 28 March 2019.

If you have not received the placement outcome by 12 July 2019, email the Unit. If you do not have email you can phone the Unit.

If you accept an offer and are also on a reserve list, you can remain on that reserve list until 3pm on 18 December 2019. At that time you must give up either the reserve place or the offer. After this time students who have accepted an offer will be removed automatically from all reserve lists.
